- Quilting items and quilting cottons are really appreciated. There is usually a line down the hall before the recycle room opens with people anxious to add to their stashes. It is our biggest contributor to the quilt show proceeds. This is the money we need to get quality speakers and meet our budget for the next two years. Fill those boxes and bring them in.

**Martin Luther Silver Springs Wish List** - Each year we donate gifts to Martin Luther Silver Springs School to help brighten their holiday. They ask that they not be wrapped. We would like them brought to the November meeting and we will see that they are delivered in time for the holidays. In the spirit of condensing the list, I am listing things that they do NOT accept. In general: no wires for remotes, no glass bottles and not spray bottles, no spiral bound journals and no weapons. The gifts are items in the clothing line like sweatshirts and t-shirts, slider sandals, baseball hats, pajama sets, watches, sports attire, novelty and sports socks and headbands and accessories. They also want large and medium stuffed animals, dream lites or twilight turtles, fuzzy posters, beyblades and accessories, art sets, sculpey clay sets, super hero figures, radio controlled vehicles and robots, matchbox or hot wheels sets and also race track sets for them, baby dolls (can be ethnic), games, lego sets, scooters with helmets and protective pads, adult coloring books, Minecraft toys, children's DVD's (G or PG), playing cards, batteries, crayons, colored pencils and washable markers, football cards, Pokemon cards, fun lip gloss, novelty tooth paste and tooth brushes, light-up bouncy balls, and non-spiral journals for boys and girls. They will also accept gift cards so they can buy things to give to families.

**Quilt for Kids** A vendor at the Oaks Quilt Show had some information about this charity that might appeal to you. After you make your two quilts for Ronald McDonald, you could consider donating to this program. They give quilts to kids in need, especially those with life-threatening illnesses and children of abuse. Due to allergens, children often cannot bring their stuffed animals to the hospital. 

The New Hexie Workshop presented in November by Jeannie Flynn

Jeannie has sent a supply list needed for the free workshop. Bring a bag lunch, so we can start right after eating lunch. Time spent on workshop will be up to how long everyone wants to stay.

Supplies needed:

1. Compass or any item that can be used as a circle template i.e: round cookie cutter, canning jar lid, old CD's, other jar lids.
  2. Scissors, paper, pencils, thimble, hand sewing needle, could be a sharp, or whatever you use to hand sew. Thread to match fabric or a neutral color.
  3. Small fabric pieces in assorted colors. Big enough to cut out the circle sizes you bring green fabric for stems.
  4. 1/2 yard prequilted fabric for background
- \* 3 inch circles finish around 1-1/2 inch hexagons.

### Some Quilt Tips from *Quilt Block of the month club.com*

Fabric Hints

1. She who has the most wins! The most important tool for quilting is your fabric collection. Build a good stash and then you'll always be able to find that special piece you need to complete a project.
2. It is better to buy more fabric than you think you need for a quilt, rather than too little, as this allows room for mistakes, shrinkage or making a sample block, and for building your stash. Also for donating to the recycle room.
3. Use different widths of masking tape to guide you in an easy way to quilt parallel lines without marking the quilt top.
4. When appliquéing, use thread that matches the color of the patch and not the background fabric.
5. Remember there are no rules about what you can create through quilting. Experiment, learn new skills, practice them, and HAVE FUN.

## HCQ 2014/15 Quilt Show Policies *(the board has approved these for the 2017 Quilt Show)*

1. HCQ shall have a two day, non-judged quilt show in the spring of odd numbered years. The suggested date is to coincide with National Quilting Day and, when possible, not be on the same days as other quilt club shows.
2. Chairperson(s) of the show shall be appointed by the newly elected president before the September meeting of the year taking office.
3. Committees for the show shall be, but not be limited to: Admissions/Advanced Tickets, Bag Raffle, Challenge, Consignment, Door Prizes, Education Room (VP in charge), Final Touches/Entrance, Kitchen (4 co-chairs), Hospitality (White Gloves) Pins, Posters and Signs, Publicity, Quilt Display Cards, Quilt Racks, Quilt Registration, Raffle Quilt, Raffle Tickets, Recycle Room, Set-up and Vendors.
4. Chairpersons shall immediately appoint the Raffle Quilt Chair so the raffle quilt can be designed, made, marked and presented to HCQ at the September meeting in the odd numbered year before the show. This quilt will be first prize at the show.
5. At the May meeting before the show, a packet of raffle tickets and a picture of the quilt will be distributed to HCQ members for them to sell.
6. There shall be items for second and third prizes of the raffle.
7. The HCQ raffle quilt will be displayed, quilted and tickets sold for it at the August 4 H Fair before the show (the even numbered year). They will also be sold if we quilt at the Grange Fair. Note: After Quilt Show, a different quilt is raffled for the 4 H Fair in the odd numbered year.
8. \$7.00 admission will be charged in 2015. Children under 12 are free. The show hours will be from 10 to 4 on both days. A private viewing for current HCQ members will be held from 9 to 10 on the first day of the show. There will be no senior discount and no strollers are allowed. An official "stamping of the hand" will enable the guest to return at no charge for the second day.

**Charitable Donations** - Our guild does quite a bit of charitable donating. The largest is our commitment to Ronald McDonald. We also donate to 9 different food pantries in our area. Martin Luther Silver Springs receives donations at Christmas. We also donate to the 4-H fair. It feels good to give back to our community.

9. A number of advanced admission tickets will be printed and made available for purchase by HCQ members to be given as a gift or thank you to friends and family, etc.
10. Door prizes will be awarded at the show.
11. There will be vendors (usually 4 or 5) depending on available space in the building.
12. Only those items made by members may be displayed in the show.
13. Items completed within the last five years may be displayed only one time in the show unless previously displayed unfinished in the Education Room.
14. HCQ members are expected to volunteer for a minimum of 6 hours during the two day show. Time may be divided between the two days.
15. A "show" pin shall be designed reflecting the pattern of the current raffle quilt and given to those members who volunteer 6 hours at the Quilt Show. Pins from previous quilt shows will be on sale for members and guests in the consignment room for \$5.00 each.
16. 10% of the sale of each item sold through the consignment room shall be retained by HCQ. Only HCQ members may consign items.
17. A percentage of the net profits from the show shall be donated to the Montgomery County Farm, Home and 4-H Foundation. The amount will be determined by recommendation of the HCQ Executive Board and the Quilt Show chairpersons and by approval of the voting body of HCQ.
18. The Foundation will suggest projects so monies may be designated for specific use. Monies will not be donated to the general operating fund of the Foundation.

Also we have advanced tickets for the quilt show that you can slip in the stockings of your friends and family.
